Principal's Comment:

Last week Mike King spoke to the Principals on his work with youth and youth suicide. What he has learnt, from listening to our children, is that their perspective on self-esteem is very different to ours. 30% of children's self-esteem is based on how they see themselves and 70% is based on how the world sees them. A child's inner critic plays a massive influence on their self view. Multiply 2 criticisms a day by 7 days a week, 365 days a year! A child then is continually focusing on what they are doing wrong. We need to support our children to focus on what they can do, what they have achieved for today, what did go well. We need to normalize the self-critic and build a sense of value in our children.
