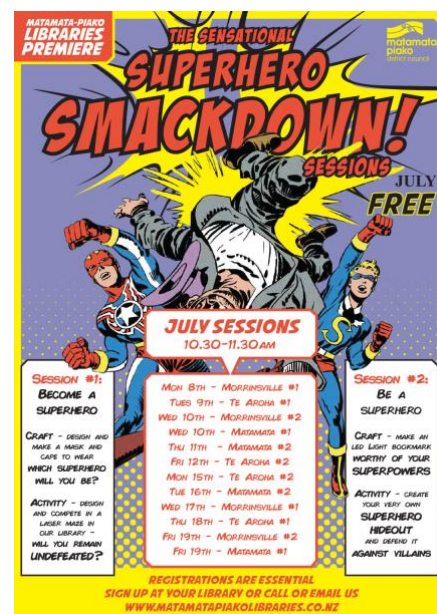

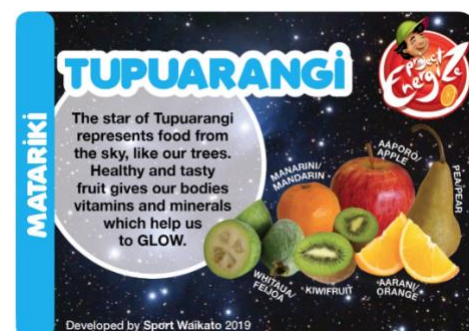
Principal's Comment:
